The Muirfield Village Civic Association (MVCA) is pleased to announce their inaugural Mother's Day Run, to be held on Saturday, May 9, 2015 here in Muirfield Village. This event will bring our community together, bring awareness to women's health, and provide people of all ages and various fitness levels the ability to participate in the event.

Muirfield Resident & Event Chair, **Jennifer Elliott** said, "The idea to bring back a 5K run to Muirfield stemmed from a close personal friend and Dublin public school teacher **Marti Hughes** who lost her battle with ovarian cancer two years ago. She was always a positive influence on all who had the privilege of knowing her. Once diagnosed with cancer,

Marti's goal was to inform women of the risk factors of ovarian cancer and the importance of early detection. During Marti's battle with cancer, she found the educational services provided by The Foundation for Women's Cancer to be beneficial to not only her but to her family. Marti's mission was to bring these educational services to women here locally in Central Ohio. After Marti passed, The Foundation was able to bring a class to Columbus this past fall. Elliott says, "The Foundation is the perfect recipient of the profits from this race because of their support of all gynecological cancers and benefits to all women!" Jennifer, who is also an oncology nurse recognizes the importance of educational support and says, "Cancer not only impacts the person who is diagnosed, but also their entire support system."

What's Next in the Orange Barrel Department?

The bike lanes on Muirfield Drive are complete, so is the new intersection at Glick and Dublin Rds. [landscaping plus paving the new bridges on Muirfield Drive will be completed in April], and Delaware County has finished the roundabout at Harriott and Concord. What infrastructure is next in this ever-improving City?

The big projects will be the I-270 at Rt. 33 interchange, and the Bridge Street District roundabout and road relocation. About the time you receive this newsletter, trees will be falling to bulldozers and dirt will be getting moved at the 270/33 interchange. No major impact will be felt until June 8th the day after the Tournament ends. Then, work will begin in earnest with the closing and tear down of the Rt. 33 bridges over I-270 for 4 months! And, the Roundabout to be constructed at the east end of Bridge St., near the new Wendy's and the Montgomery Inn will lead to lane reductions, 1 lane in each of the four directions. Read the Dublin Villager and check the City website as the time approaches, and plan to give yourself extra time there with alternate routes ready around it all. Keep in mind that many people will be using those alternate routes, so

WENDY SUMMERHILL-JOHNSON



When most of us are about ready to fall off the wagon with our new years resolutions of eating well and exercising daily, one fellow Muirfield resident, Wendy Summerhill-Johnson, will be doing what she has done every other day for the past 25 years! Training! An avid marathon runner turned Iron Woman; Wendy is just warming up for her first race of the season, the Boston Marathon. The first marathon of many other distance races including other marathons, triathlons, and ironman triathlons that she will conquer in 2015!

Wendy started her running career at the young age of 12 and never looked back. It was running for her high school in Manhattan, Kansas where she developed her passion for the sport. At 22, she ran her first marathon and since then has completed more than 30 marathons, rarely skipping a day of training! Last year, Wendy successfully completed the Boston, Columbus, and San Antonio Marathon along with three ½ Marathons, one Triathlon, one ½ Ironman, and a full Ironman triathlon – a feat most of us will never accomplish in a lifetime let alone in one year. Wendy says, "it's her love of training and continually trying to improve herself that motivates her to keep going". This past year when Wendy felt she needed a break from running, she turned to triathlons incorporating swimming and biking into her training regime. A typical training week is 17-20 hours including approximately 30-50 miles of running, 4,000 -10,000 yards in the pool and approximately 180 miles on the bike. Simply amazing! Wendy's ultimate goal is to qualify for the Ironman World Championships in Kona, Hawaii.

But for this Iron Woman, there is more to life than just running, swimming and cycling. Wendy, together with her husband, **Glenn** moved to Muirfield three years ago to raise their two kids **Nolan** (11) and **Emma** (10). Wendy and Glenn chose Muirfield because of its amazing amenities such as the pools, paths and nearby golf courses! Glen is the head golf pro at nearby York Golf Club and Wendy also works full time as a family physician at her own practice, Summerhill Family Medicine, just minutes from Muirfield. Owning her own practice has allowed her the flexibility for raising her children and maintaining her training schedule. Life is never dull in the Johnson household between working full time, getting the kids to and from school and after school sports, assisting with homework, preparing meals as well as maintaining an arduous training schedule.

Wendy says she hopes her work ethic is setting a good example for both Nolan and Emma. Nolan, an avid baseball player and Emma, a gymnast, are learning the value of sport though both Wendy and Glenn. She hopes that their passion for sports is showing them that they have to work hard for what they want, that you never quit as well as the importance of staying active, eating right and exercising daily.

So if you happen to see Wendy running or cycling on the paths of Muirfield or training in the pools this summer, don't forget to wish her well with her upcoming races! And remember, it's not the time to fall off the wagon with your new years resolutions! Get out there, set some goals and accomplish what you really want in your life!



GIRLS ON THE RUN - GOING STRONG AT DEER

This fall, 32 Muirfield Girls in 3rd – 5th grade completed the second season of Girls on the Run at Deer Run, making this the largest group yet, doubling the group's size to a total of 46 girls participating!

These terrific girls completed a 10-week program aimed at solidifying their feelings of self-confidence, identity and connectedness. They learned about making positive choices, valuing what makes us unique, and developing many more life skills that will carry them through their teen years. At the same time, they trained for the season finale, a celebratory 5K running event at Columbus Commons with thousands of other girls from all around Franklin County on November 15th. Every one of our girls had a fantastic run at the 5K!

The Girls on the Run curriculum is developed by the national Girls on the Run organization, facilitated by the Franklin County Girls on the Run chapter, and ultimately delivered to our girls by parent and community volunteers. This fall, 13 of our volunteer coaches were Muirfield Moms, thank you volunteers!

The coaches are so proud of the accomplishments of these girls, and we're very excited to see interest in the program growing. The 46 girls who participated represent about 1/3 of all the 3rd - 5th grade girls at Deer Run.

What, a cemetery in the center of Muirfield? Yes! A very old cemetery, according to some records dating to the late 1700's, when Dublin began being settled by the first non-Native Americans. There are at least 40 marked graves, and undoubtedly many more where tombstones were not used or have gone missing. Known now as the "Mt. Zion Cemetery," after the church that once stood next to it [the subject of a future article], it is located

on Kinross Ct. just north of Memorial Drive. Hundreds of thousands of people have walked past the rear of this historic

ground on their way into the main entrance of the Memorial Tournament. There is a newer marker there now, listing many names out of Dublin's history, early settlers buried there. The tombstones are fading, but interesting to read.

Four men, buried adjacent to one another have the same dates of death, February 17, 1863. You may be thinking "Civil War casualties?" but that is not correct. A newspaper report at that time described the explosion of a boiler at Sawmill near the Scioto, so fierce that some bodies were blown up into trees. These graves are in the area toward the rear, on the right side. Another marker is for triplets, who died shortly after birth.

A legend at the time said that when there is a morning fog in the fall, walking anywhere near Ash Baugh Rd. (the original name for Kinross) if you stop and listen you might hear the rattle of a wagon taking a casket to the cemetery!

have not only a "Plan B" but also a "Plan C" ready to plug in as traffic dictates. And please, please, please, patronize the merchants and restaurants sure to be hurt by all of this. Let's keep them in business.

Orange barrels will also be up this spring along Muirfield Drive at both Avery and Tullymore, so minor modifications can be made prohibiting left turns from side streets onto Muirfield or Avery-Muirfield.

In June the City will be constructing a multi-use path, not a bike lane, along the south side of Glick between Davington and Muirfield Drive. Design is underway now, with work scheduled to begin in June, finish by year's end. A homeowner refusing to sell an easement has stalled the remaining section of the Dublin to Avery Road city path, between Carnoustie and Muirkirk. The City is seeking the right to an easement under eminent domain, and the case has had a first hearing in court in Delaware.

A little farther from Muirfield, the City will be constructing in 2015 another roundabout near the new medical college, Eiterman Road at 161, and will finish the multi-use path on Dublin Rd. south to Waterford.

The group welcomes riders of all abilities whether you just bought a bike and it's still sitting in your garage, have cycled recreationally but want to get together with a group to ride more seriously or have some serious experience riding with lots of miles under your tires. No riders will be left behind.

"Our goal is to form a group of riders that want to get some exercise, better themselves, and make new friends by riding both on road (road biking) and off road (mountain biking), with sub groups based on speed, experience and ability," says Bridget.

The cycling groups will meet 1-2 times a week and leave from a designated neighborhood location (TBD). We are open to route suggestions and would love others to lead rides of their favorite routes! All routes will mainly be kept to road riding so a proper bike, helmet and hydration is required on all rides. New routes could be established each week and group leaders will pace and lead each of the sub groups.


